# State-Specific Fluoride Varnish Information North Dakota Established in 2012

## **General Program Description**

In 2007, the North Dakota Legislature passed legislation allowing health-care providers (physicians, physician's assistants, nurse practitioners, registered nurses and licensed practical nurses) to assess oral health and apply fluoride varnish to help prevent tooth decay for high-risk children ages birth through 21 years for Medicaid enrollees, or birth through 18 years for Healthy Steps enrollees. Research shows that application of fluoride varnish can reduce tooth decay by 25 to 45 percent and remineralize early carious lesions.

### Coding and Reimbursement

1) Verify that you or your clinic is an enrolled Medicaid provider, along with being an enrolled member of Blue Cross Blue Shield for Healthy Steps.

An enrolled provider will have a current provider number.

### 2) For Medicaid clients - verify the client eligibility.

Medicaid pays for services provided only on the day in which the child is eligible for coverage. Providers may call the Eligibility Verification System at 800.428.4140 or 701.328.2891. You will need the provider number and the recipient's Medicaid identification number for verification purposes.

**For Healthy Steps clients** – Healthy Steps is a 12-month continuous eligibility from birth through 18 years of age.

### 3) Submit claims for payment.

Claims may be submitted on paper or electronically for both Medicaid and Healthy Steps. Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) is a fast and cost effective alternative to paper claim submission.

- Use CMS -1500 claim form.
- Use the dental procedure code **D1206** for fluoride varnish when billing Medicaid.
- Use the dental procedure code **D1206** and ICD 9 code **V07.31** for fluoride varnish when billing Healthy Steps.
- Bill Medicaid within one year from the date of service.
- Bill Healthy Steps within 18 months from the date of service.

\* Beginning July 1, 2013, Healthy Steps will provide benefits to its members for topical application of fluoride varnish with a maximum benefit allowance of two applications per benefit period. This may be provided to the member during their well-child exam by a physician, physician's assistant or nurse practitioner who has received appropriate board-approve d training. A registered nurse or licensed practical nurse, under the direct supervision of a physician must submit under the physician's NPI if within their appropriate board license and after receiving appropriate board-approved training.

# **Training and Certification Requirements**

All health-care providers wishing to apply fluoride varnish must successfully complete a North Dakota State Board of Dental Examiner's approved training program through the Smiles for Life curriculum at <a href="www.smilesforlifeoralhealth.org">www.smilesforlifeoralhealth.org</a>. Click on Course 6: Caries Risk Assessment, Fluoride Varnish and Counseling.

Upon completion of the Smiles for Life online curriculum, you are requested to complete the online training completion form which may be accessed <a href="here">here</a>. Submission of the training completion form will comply with the current requirement to apply fluoride varnish under North Dakota Century Code Chapter 43-17-43 for physicians and physician's assistants; and North Dakota Century Code Chapters 43-28-02.6 and 43-28-02.7 for advanced practice nurses, registered nurses and licensed practical nurses.

Public health hygienists are also available at no cost as an additional resource for information, as well as clinical fluoride varnish application demonstration training. NOTE: Both free nursing contact hour and CME credit are available. A printed certificate of completion is needed for verification of CME credits. You must be a registered user to print a certificate of completion. (Register as a new user at the beginning of training.) To print a certificate of completion, you must complete all the post-test questions, a brief evaluation, and then press Submit to view the "Thank You" page where you have the option to print or save a certificate of completion.
